Day-01: Yoga session & General Demographic Survey of Village

01st May 2026

The Day 01 of the NSS Seven-Day Special Camp organized by the National Service Scheme of St. Xavier's College, Ranchi, at **Pahantoli village, Namkum**, was conducted with great enthusiasm and active participation from **65 NSS volunteers**. The day began with a team-building activity in the form of a yoga session at 8:30AM. All volunteers actively participated in various yoga exercises and breathing techniques, which helped improve their physical well-being, mental concentration, and team spirit. The session also created a positive and disciplined environment, preparing the volunteers for the activities planned during the camp.

Following the yoga session, the volunteers undertook a **General Demographic Survey of Pahantoli village**. Divided into groups, the volunteers visited households and interacted with village residents to collect information regarding population, family composition, educational status, occupation, housing conditions, and access to basic amenities.





The survey provided an opportunity for the volunteers to engage directly with the community and gain a better understanding of the village's social and economic conditions. The data collected will serve as a valuable resource for identifying local needs and planning community-oriented activities during the remaining days of the camp



The first day of the NSS Seven-Day Special Camp at Pahantoli, Namkum was productive and informative. The yoga session strengthened team cohesion, while the demographic survey enabled the volunteers to gain firsthand knowledge of the village community. The day concluded with volunteers motivated and prepared for the upcoming activities of the camp.

Day-02: Yoga Session & Employment Generation Programme in collaboration with Sajha Dahar Foundation with POSCO Awareness Session

02nd May 2026

The Day 02 of the NSS Seven-Day Special Camp at Pahantoli, Namkum, began with a morning team-building activity (Yoga) encouraged cooperation, communication, and unity among the volunteers. The activity energized the participants and prepared them for the day's community-oriented programmes.

The awareness session aimed to educate villagers about HIV/AIDS, its modes of transmission, preventive measures, available treatment options, and the importance of eliminating misconceptions and stigma associated with the disease.

The testing process was initiated with the NSS volunteers themselves, setting an example and encouraging villagers to participate without fear or hesitation. The volunteers' willingness to undergo testing helped build trust and motivated many villagers to come forward for the check-up. The initiative emphasized the importance of regular health screening, early detection, and responsible healthcare practices.

The collaboration with JSACS helped spread important information about HIV/AIDS and encouraged villagers to adopt a proactive approach towards health check-ups and disease prevention. Day-05: Mega Health Checkup Camp & Sanitary Pad distribution drive at Gurutoli and Kumhartoli

05th May 2026

The Day 05 of the Seven-Day Special Camp was dedicated to promoting healthcare and well-being among the residents of **Gurutoli and Kumhartoli** through a Mega Health Checkup Camp. The camp witnessed active participation from villagers, NSS volunteers, and a team of medical professionals who worked together to ensure that essential healthcare services reached the community.

Throughout the camp, **Shri Satya Prakash & Shri Ravi Prakash, directors from JSACS** appreciated NSS SXC mega health checkup camp and made villagers more aware of HIV and AIDS. NSS volunteers played a crucial role in assisting the medical team, managing registrations, guiding patients, and encouraging community members to undergo health checkups. Their efforts helped increase participation and awareness regarding the importance of regular health monitoring and timely medical intervention.

In addition to health consultations, medicines were distributed free of cost to individuals based on their medical needs and prescriptions. The camp also focused on women's health and hygiene. **Sanitary pads were distributed** to women and adolescent girls, accompanied by an awareness session on menstrual hygiene management. The participants were educated about the importance of maintaining personal hygiene during the menstrual cycle, the proper use and disposal of sanitary products, and the need to break social taboos surrounding menstruation.

The Mega Health Checkup Camp served as an important initiative in addressing healthcare needs within the community. Through medical assistance, health awareness, and hygiene education, the programme contributed to improving the overall well-being of the villagers and reinforced the spirit of community service among the volunteers.



The fifth day of the camp successfully brought essential healthcare services closer to the community. The active involvement of doctors and volunteers, along with the focus on women's health and hygiene, made the programme both beneficial and impactful for the residents of Gurutoli and Kumhartoli.

Day-06: Team Building activity (Tug of War & Football) and Cleanliness Drive with Green Pledge and Plantation Drive

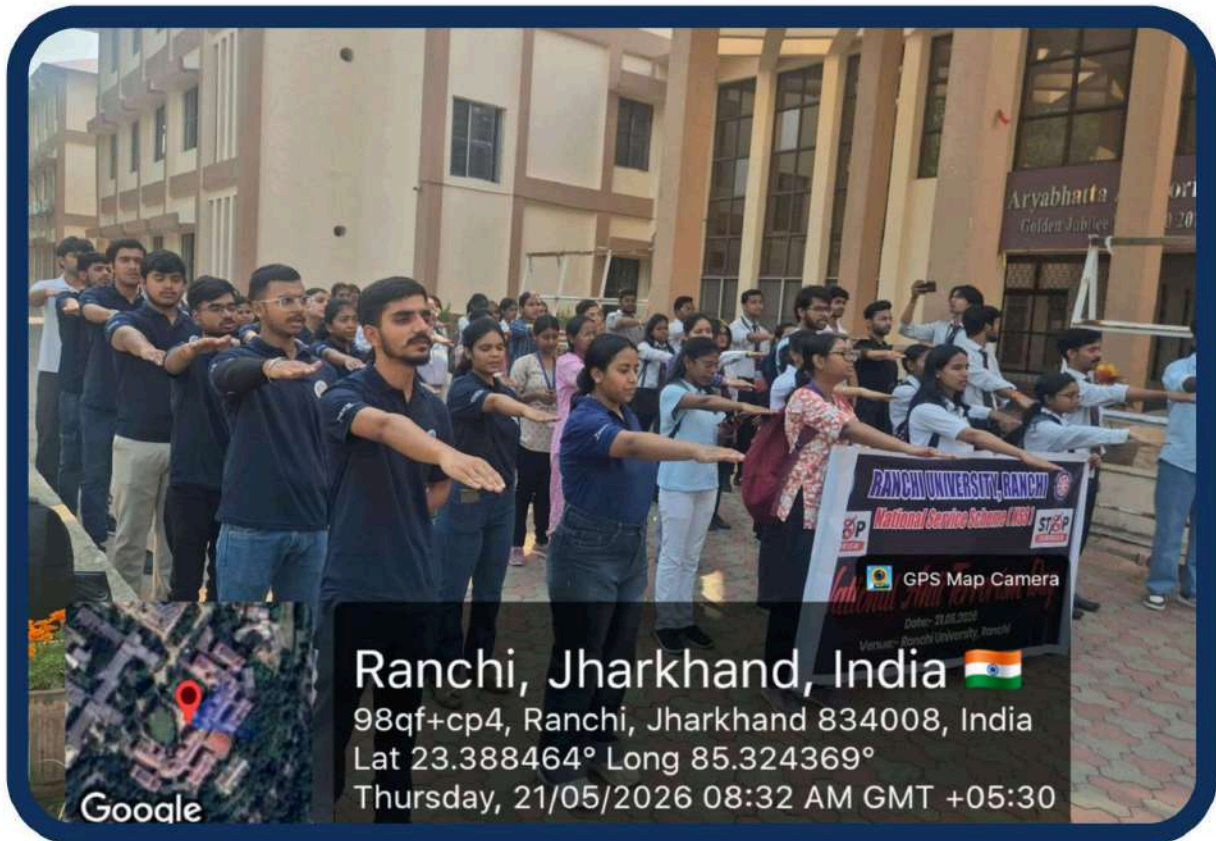

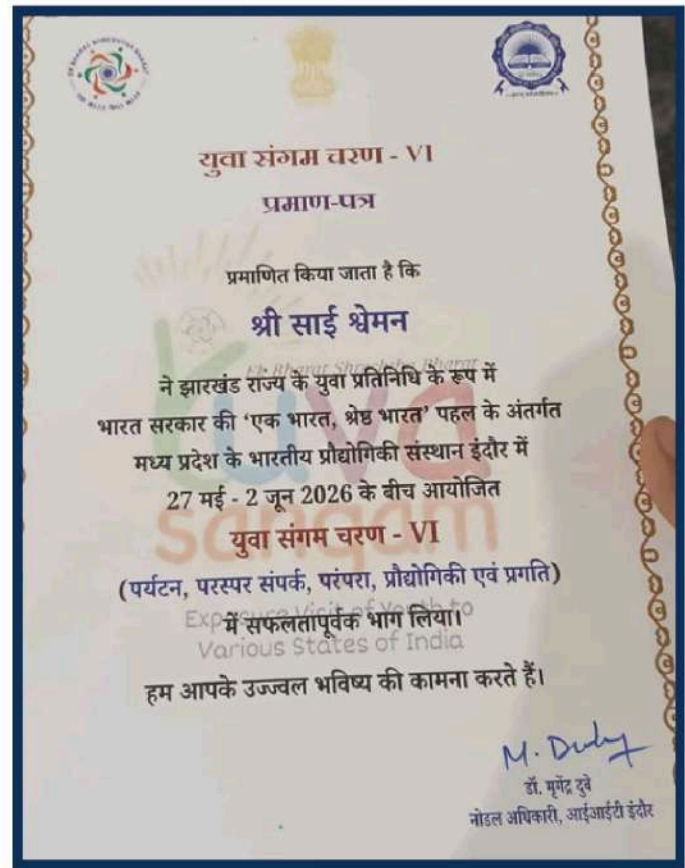
